Sponsored Skill workshop and training programme on "Scientific Pig Farming and value addition of pork" organized by ICAR- NRC on Pig, Rani

A three-day residential Skill workshop and training programme on "Scientific Pig Farming and value addition of pork" was organized by ICAR- NRC on Pig, Rani during April 25-27, 2023. The programme was sponsored by KSHYAMATA programme, Assam Agribusiness & Rural Transformation Project of the District Industries & Commerce Centre (DICC), Govt. of Assam, Jorhat.
