The Tribal Sub Plan-sponsored 3-days training programme on "Scientific Production Practices and health management for profitable Pig farming" was successfully held at ICAR-National Research Centre on Pig from July 29- 31, 2024. Dr V.K. Gupta, Director, ICAR-NRC on Pig, Rani, Guwahati acted as the course director and the programme coordinators were Dr. Juwar Doley, Dr. Priyajoy Kar and Dr. N. H. Mohan. Nineteen participants from five states (Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Nagaland, Madhya Pradesh) were benefitted from the training programme.

The course covered a wide range of topics starting from housing, management, breeding, reproduction, nutrition, health, hygienic pork processing, useful software's & and applications, SHGs, FPOs, Marketing and Routine management. During the first day, sessions on breeding strategies, housing management, health management and stress management were covered. On the second day, important topics like Artificial Insemination, Value Addition in pork products, credit assistance was taken by the faculty of ICAR-National Research Centre on Pig. On the final day, sessions on biosecurity, nutritional management, waste management, record keeping, reproductive management were taken by the concerned experts. In the Q&A session, various questions were addressed, and feedback was received. The post-training evaluation showed a marked improvement in the trainees' knowledge levels. Feedback form showed excellent ratings by the trainees.

The valedictory ceremony was graced by Dr. Vivek Kumar Gupta (Director, ICAR-National Research Centre on Pig) along with Dr. N.H. Mohan (Principal Scientist & National Fellow), Dr. Pranab Jyoti Das (Principal Scientist and In charge-TSP) Dr. Rafiqul Islam (Principal Scientist and in charge, Training cell) and staff of the Institute. Dr. Juwar Doley, Senior Scientist briefed about the key details and feedbacks of the training programme. The certificates were distributed by the honorable Director. In his address, he highlighted the importance of entrepreneurship development for youth and farmers in pig husbandry. A training kit, including a natural fiber bag, notebook, and pen, was also provided to the trainees. The valedictory session concluded with a vote of thanks from Dr. Priyajoy Kar, Scientist.
